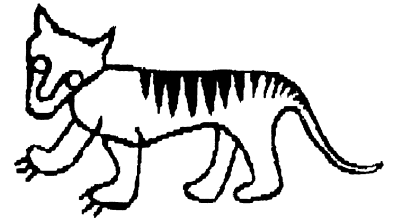

Going places

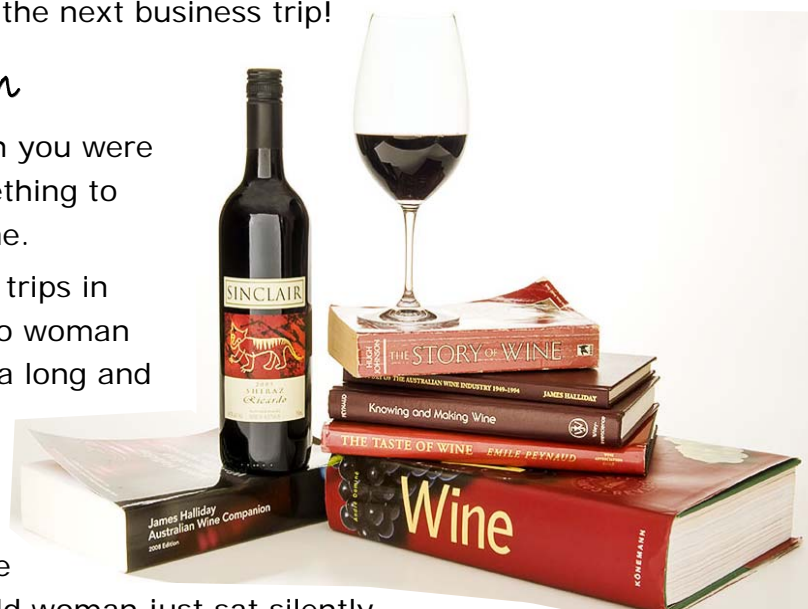
